






Folk the Recession


Scorpion





Daniel Barry, parish priest of Borrisokane, Co. Tipperary, feels like the wrong man in the wrong place at the wrong time. He works hard to fulfill his duty, has nothing in common with his parishioners and secretly fears he has lost his vocation. When forced by his bishop to start a big fundraising campaign, he attempts to reconcile his passion for film with his duty to the church through the creation of the Stella Cinema. But he faces plenty of opposition: from the bishop and a number of influential parishioners who see film as a source of moral corruption; from locals; and ultimately from his own crisis of conscience.

Tuesday 29th January 2013, 8:00pm, Circumstance

Dir: Maryam Keshavarz, 2011, France/Iran, 106 mins, Cert: CLUB

Starring: Nikohi Boosheri, Sarah Kazeym, Reza Sixo Safai

The film revolves around the friendship and blossoming romance of two beautiful young women, the privileged and wealthy Atafeh and the lower-class Shireen, who yearn to escape to Dubai. The two walk around Tehran with their heads covered in long gowns, but wearing tank tops and short dresses underneath. Atafeh's brother, who gets involved with religious fundamentalists, becomes aware of the nature of the relationship between the young women, leading to consequences that are emotionally and politically devastating. Winner Audience Award Sundance Film Festival 2011.

Tuesday 5th February 2013, 8:00pm, The Imposter

Dir: Bart Layton, UK, 2012, 95 mins, Cert: 15A

This documentary is as gripping as any thriller. In 1994, a 13-year old Texan boy was reported missing. Three years later his grieving family was overjoyed to be told that he had turned up in Spain. The mysterious boy was completely different however - darker skin tone, different colour eyes, clearly much older than 16. Yet the family appeared to accept him. A fascinating film, full of suspense and drama, which shows that the scariest kind of trickster is the one who believes it himself.

Tuesday 12th February 2013, 8:00pm, In Your Hands

Dir: Lola Doillon, France 2010, 90 mins, Cert: 15A

Starring: Kirstin Scott Thomas, Pio Marmai

A subtle psychological thriller, the film revolves around the story of Anna, a surgeon at a prison hospital, who has been held hostage by Yann, the vengeful husband of a patient who died during a Caesarean operation that Anna conducted. Over time Anna begins to seek out Yann, in a delayed instance of the Stockholm syndrome, and an intriguing drama ensues.

His carefree adolescence is cut short, however, when his father and uncle inflame a centuries-old land dispute by killing a neighbour. The film is a powerful coming-of-age story, combining ancient blood feud and the contemporary world. Winner Silver Bear for Best Screenplay, 2011 Berlin Film Festival.

The film starts with Iris sending off her best friend Jack to a soul-renewing sojourn at her family's remote holiday cabin. When he arrives, he finds her sister Hannah already there. They share a tequila-fuelled one-night stand and then torment each other with the ifs, whys and buts of telling Iris - when Iris turns up unannounced. An amusing gem of a film, this is a captivating examination of criss-crossing relationships permeated by incisive performances.

Sepideh has orchestrated a weekend away at a Caspian seaside resort with a group of friends. Among them is Ahmad an old friend lately returned to Iran, and Elly who teaches Sepideh's daughter. Sepideh is determined to play matchmaker and Elly and Ahman seem to hit it off. Then Elly disappears and when the friends search for her they discover that not everything is as it seems. A tense domestic mystery from the director of A Separation.

Dir: Christian Petzold, Germany 2012, 105 mins, Cert: 12A

Aslow-burning Cold Wardrama with an ultimate emotional payoff. Set in a secluded East German village during the summer of 1980, the film portrays the stifling day-to-day grind of a country doctor, Barbara, torn between her desire to flee to the West and her growing attachment to a fellow doctor. When her West German boyfriend, Jorg, arrives with the offer of a sure-fire wayout, this sets the stage for a denouement where Barbara's conflicts come to a head.

Tuesday 19th March 2013, 8:00pm, 5 Broken Cameras

Dir: Emat Burnat, Guy Davidi, France/Israel/Palestine 2011, 90 mins, Cert: CLUB

His West Bank hometown of Bil'in having turned into a site of weekly civil disobedience and provocative Israeli land development, Palestinian Emad Burnat, a family man, began to document the clash in 2005. Five broken cameras later, he produced a documentary that is eye opening, placing the viewer in the face of interrogating Israeli soldiers and dangerously close to Humvees being stoned. Winner Audience Award Stranger Than Fiction Documentary Festival 2012; and Sheffield Documentary Festival 2012.

Tuesday 26th March 2013, 8:00pm, The Angel's Share

Dir: Ken Loach, UK 2012, 106 mins, Cert: 15A

Starring: Roger Allam, Daniel Portman, John Henshaw

A group of young offenders is given community service and comes under the supervision of Harry, who is a connoisseur of fine malt whisky. He takes them painting older community centres, cleaning cemeteries, on a tour of a distillery and then to a whisky tasting in Edinburgh. When the group hears of an extremely-valuable old whisky being auctioned, they plan an ultra low-tech heist. This is a very funny film, with excellent performances from a non-professional cast.
